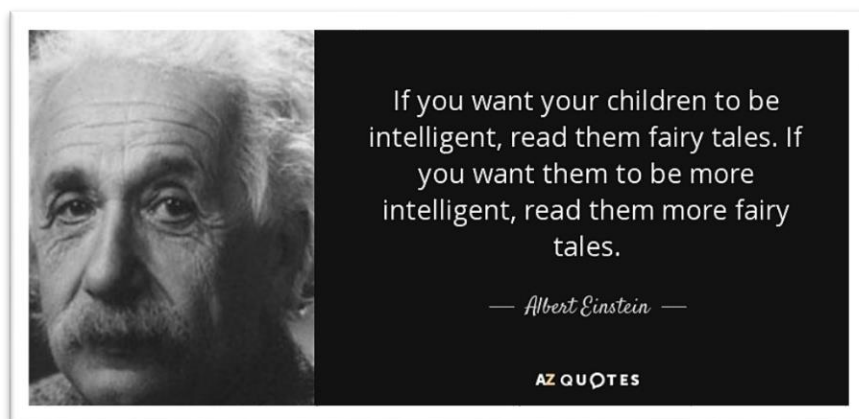

Bookclub

We do offer once a Term Scholastic Bookclub. The catalogues will be coming home with students Friday 23rd February and orders closing Friday 2nd March.

All orders are placed online through the Scholastic Bookclub website. It is a cashless Bookclub. Each Bookclub order each Term generally generates a \$600 credit for our school Library. That means our students are the real winners with an extra \$2,400 of quality literature being contributed to our Library Collection with no cost to the school.

Each Bookclub issue you will find some amazing bargain prices. It is a great opportunity to stock up on gifts for birthday parties – have a few titles at hand in a mystery stash for those unexpected invites or when you're rushed off your feet and don't quite get to the shops! However, please do not feel pressured in any way to purchase. It is an added opportunity if you wish.

Read Aloud Bookmarks

Through the Library I have created and operate a Reading Reward Program that is part of the whole school 'Lighting the Way' award system. It is to encourage and promote the skill of **reading text aloud** with correct **pronunciation, fluency and expression**. Children need to read aloud to an adult or high school person for ten minutes, and then the adult need only sign off on the record card/bookmark to validate the reading.

Once 14 spaces are complete with signatures, the child returns the bookmark to me in the Library either before school, lunch 2, Library lesson or after school. The student receives a commendation award, a sticker, new coloured levelled bookmark to continue and their name is published in the next newsletter to publically acknowledge and reward their reading efforts.

This program has now been operating in the Library for 14 years. The longitudinal data of this program and the families and children who participate clearly represents students who achieve academic success if not excellence.

Approaching Our School

A parent and community guide for seeking information and expressing concerns

From time to time, parents or other members of the school community may need to approach the school in order to:

- ✚ Discuss the progress or welfare of own child
- ✚ Express concern about actions of other students
- ✚ Enquire about school policy or practice
- ✚ Express other various concerns

It is therefore necessary, to have procedures that will help solve problems as soon as possible so that a safe and harmonious school environment is maintained.

The best results usually flow from working together.

These guidelines aim to:

- ✚ provide a guide in order that concerns are dealt with in an open and fair manner.
- ✚ ensure that the rights of students, teachers and parents are respected and upheld.
- ✚ support sensitivity and confidentiality.
- ✚ help reach an agreed solution

On occasions, concerns may cause frustration and anxiety. At such times, it is always important to organise a time to talk with school staff in an unhurried and confidential atmosphere.

Please note under no circumstances should parents ever speak to other children or interrupt classroom learning to discuss an issue. Schools need always remain a safe environment for all.

CONCERN	APPROPRIATE ACTION
The academic progress of own child	Directly contact the child's teacher either by note, by phone or in person to arrange a suitable time to discuss any issues.
The welfare of own child	For minor issues directly contact your child's teacher to clarify information. For more serious concerns, contact office. State nature of concern and arrange a suitable time to talk with class teacher or appropriate staff member. To convey information about change of address, telephone number, emergency contact, custody details, health issues etc. Please contact the office.
Actions of other students	Contact the class teacher for a classroom problem. Contact the classroom teacher, then Stage AP, then Mrs Jordan/Mrs Mangold (DP) and finally Mr Harris for any playground problems.
School policy or practice	Contact office. State nature of concern and make an appointment to see Mrs Jordan/Mrs Mangold; then Mr Harris or an appropriate member of staff.
