MINDSET: Fixed & Growth Mindset

Why we quit easily and lack motivation.

Perhaps you're "naturally academically gifted" or perhaps you have to work hard at school to achieve good results and even then "good results" may not be that great. Many students believe the reason they don't get good results is that they are not smart. As a result, they give up easily and lack motivation. Why bother working hard on a task if it is only going to end up making you feel disappointed or worse a failure.

What successful people have that most people don't have.

Successful people believe that failure is good! Yes, you read that right. Michael Jordon says, "I've failed over and over in my life and that is why I succeed". Some people see failure as a guide, clue, message, and information about what to improve so they can achieve their goal (they have a growth mindset). On the other hand, people who quit easily at the slightest hint of difficulty believe that failure is a reflection of who they are (fixed mindset).

What are fixed and growth mindsets?

1. Fixed Mindset


Many students believe that intelligence is fixed, that each person has a certain amount and that's it. This has been described as a fixed mindset. Students with this mindset worry about how much of this fixed intelligence they possess. A fixed mindset makes challenges threatening for students (because they believe that their fixed ability may not be up to the task) and it makes mistakes and failures upsetting (because they believe that such setbacks reflect badly on their level of fixed intelligence).

2. Growth Mindset

Other students believe that intelligence is something that can be cultivated through effort and education. They don't necessarily believe that everyone has the same abilities or that anyone can be as smart as Einstein, but they do believe that everyone can improve their abilities. They understand that even Einstein wasn't Einstein until he put in years of focused hard work. Students with this growth mindset believe that intelligence is a potential that can be developed through learning. As a result, confronting challenges, learning from mistakes, and persevering in the face of setbacks become ways of getting smarter.

The Tell Them From Me student feedback survey

We are delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the **Tell Them From Me** student feedback survey. The survey aims to help improve student learning outcomes and measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in 2016 and 2017 and will again this year in term 1 and 3. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year. *More information about the survey is available at: <u>http://surveys.cese.nsw.gov.au/information-for-parents</u>*

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help improve how they do things at school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 will be invited to participate. A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey has been sent home with students. If you **<u>do not</u>** want your child or children to participate, please inform the school by **Monday 13 August 2018**. The *Partners in Learning* parent feedback survey

This Term, our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between **Monday 27 August and Friday 26 October**. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary, your responses are very much appreciated.



Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school

Here are a few things you can do to help keep your children and others safer during drop-off and pick-up times during the school week:

- Make sure your children are fastened in the correct child car seat for their age and size and that it is fitted correctly.
- Stick to the 40km/h speed limit in a school zone and look out for children who may be about.
- Watch for flashing lights on buses. They let you know that there may be children crossing or about to cross the road. A 40km/h limit applies when school bus lights flash.
- Always give way to pedestrians particularly when entering and leaving driveways.
- Always park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.
- Drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road in your school's designated drop-off and pick-up area. Never call out to them from across the road – they may run to you without checking for traffic.
- It's safest for children to get out of the car through the Safety Door, away from passing traffic. This is the rear footpath side door of the car.
