Congratulations to our four finalists Sarah, Jai, Noah Ryan for the Spelling Bee Challenge 2018. We were all very proud of your achievement!




Anti-Bullying Plan

It was written with input from teachers and authors. The article is located on the Department of Education's School A-Z a practical help for parents website. The parts of the article that I think are most interesting are:

- What makes a good book for young kids? Any book they want to read.
- Books with vivid imagery, exciting stories and strong characters will not only entertain your child but set them up to enjoy reading for the rest of their life.
- Good children's books share qualities with good adult novels. Firstly, quality writing is never boring. Good children's books, no matter how simple or complex, have a sense of joy. They can make us laugh and cry. Regardless of how young, readers need strong characters who they can relate to and care about.
- The best way to know if it is a good book for your child is through your child. Allow them
 to reject the books they dislike and encourage them to tell you what it is they do like in
 others.


Choosing good books for your kids

- When choosing a good book for your kids, parents should "resist the desire to only feed their children the books they loved when they were young".
- Expose them to books you thought were fabulous as a kid, but don't be too precious. Quite often kids will reject it precisely because you've offered it – they want to find something for themselves.

 Great stories also use language that is rich and challenging. By that, often in a children's book there will be words that a kid doesn't know. That doesn't matter because that's how you actually learn more complex language – by reading books that contain it so you are exposed to it in context.

School Swimming & Water Safety Awareness Program

Tournament of Minds - 2018

Our Tournament of Minds journey began day one, this term. Students were allocated a discipline and a team of people to work with. Challenges were published and our room was filled with excitement and energy; 28 minds thinking, devising and creating. Students worked on their team challenge for 5 weeks, incorporating collaboration and team work, plot development, script writing, props and costume design and the list goes on.

Each team had to work towards meeting specific criteria in order to meet the demands of their team's challenge. Ideas were tossed around, scripts were rewritten, props and backdrops planned and painted. Students worked tirelessly to meet the demands of the challenge, within a specific time frame.

A team from each discipline (Social Sciences, Language Literature, STEM and The Arts) competed at the Regional Tournament held at Coffs Harbour Education Campus on Sunday 26th August. This trip proved to be very successful. We had three teams placing first, Social Sciences, Language Literature and The Arts with our STEM team gaining honours. This meant a trip to Sydney to compete at the State Tournament.

Competing at Sydney was a whole new experience for some of our Stage 3 students. We made our way to the University of NSW; we were one school in a group of 38 state-wide.

Our students were placed in a 3 hour lock down and given a whole new challenge as well as a spontaneous challenge. The other schools were very competitive and the standard was outstanding.

Finally, at the end of a very long day, the presentation began. The judges had made their decisions and were to inform us if we were coming home to plan a trip to Darwin for the Tournament International Final.

Our Language Literature team won their discipline and unfortunately, the Social Sciences and Arts group missed out on a place.

Non-Teaching Staff School Introduction Training Days

The Department of Education is seeking people who are interested in commencing work within public schools in your area.

The School Administrative and Support (SAS) Staff Reference Group welcome any people looking to start work in school administration to enrol in our Non-Teaching Staff School Introduction training programs.

The aim of this training is to provide participants with an overview of school administrative roles. Participation in these introduction days are **not** a guarantee of employment with the Department of Education. Participants are required to obtain a Working with Children Check (WWCC) clearance for paid work at their own cost. https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check. Payment is then made through Service NSW prior to attending day one. To enable processing for potential employment participants are required to bring necessary completed forms, which appear on the MyPL registration page. Many schools have a policy of not employing current parents or associates within their own school.

It would be desirable if participants had a sound knowledge of the Microsoft Office suite. The

training days will be held in the following locations:

To secure a place in this course, participants will need to register online as a community member on MyPL. Go to the following site https://mypl.education.nsw.gov.au/ and select Register. After completing the details, an email will be sent with instructions on how to get started and select the venue you wish to attend. The course codes are Day 1: NR22842, Day 2: NR22844.

There will be no cost to the participant other than them acquiring their WWCC prior to attending the training. Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day. Participants are to provide their own morning tea and lunch.
