## From the Desk of Mr Harris

#### Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It's already the end of Week 4 and time continues to fly. Our children have returned this year keen to enjoy 2019. A major focus of all schools is to build independence and resilience with our children and our wellbeing program does just that. The power of home and school working together achieves so much.

The ever growing use of technology and social media continues to be a concern with every educator. Yes, it has its place, but please don't forget that for most apps, children need to be 13 or above and should always have parent permission! The problem that schools often have, is children accessing these apps below the age of 13 and using them in a way that is often unkind!

Phones are not encouraged at Tacking Point and there are strict guidelines if they come to school. They are not to be seen or used in any fashion during the school day (using apps or listening to music). Likewise, iPad/tablets are discouraged as they can easily be broken. School is a perfect place to develop and foster friendships instead of playing with these.

#### **Meet and Greet**

Many thanks to our families who joined us on that evening. It was a great opportunity to touch base with your child's teacher and be 100% aware of 2019 happenings and routines. The feedback was positive from our parents and it has been wonderful to see parents being proactive and contacting teachers for an interview to commence 2019 on a positive note.

#### Expectations

At this time of the year, teachers are working hard on increasing expectations in regards to behaviour, manners, work ethic, homework, resilience and working collaboratively in their current classes. Our mantra this year is to make every moment count and capitalise on every learning opportunity. Once expectations are fully known and understood, this will maximise learning.

#### **Major Excursions**

At your Meet and Greet, you would have been made aware of Stage 2 and 3 major excursions and possible expected costs. There will be a strict adherence to payments this year and these must be made by any due dates given. If there are any problems or concerns, we ask you to contact the school in advance and we will assist. All children have the right to attend these major excursions and assistance in many forms can be given to assist with children attending. We are here to help! **#letusknow** 

#### Fees for 2019.

Payment for our family voluntary contributions can now be made to the school office. The payment this year is \$49 plus a \$5 paper levy. This year we are planning to purchase 40 additional iPads for classroom use. Our children *greatly* benefit from this contribution, as the entire amount is utilised for the purchase of extra classroom resources.

#### Holidays

Many of our children shine in many different sporting fields. Holidays are the perfect time for clinics and major competitions. I was delighted to hear about one such boy in Year 1..... Joshua Harris.

During the Christmas school holidays, Joshua attended the Steve Waugh Cricket Coaching Clinic at the historic Bradman Oval in Bowral in the Southern Highlands of NSW. Bradman Oval is the home ground of the legendary Sir Donald Bradman. Aimed at young players, the partnership between the Bradman Foundation and Steve Waugh Cricket continues the tradition of providing a unique opportunity for young cricketers (girls and boys aged between 6 and 16) to develop their skills during the school holidays. Around 40 children attended the three-day January 2019 clinic. Joshua was presented with the trophy for the most improved player at the clinic. Great work!

## Respectful communication is a right

#### Read Aloud Bookmarks

The Library operates a whole school reading rewards program to encourage regular reading aloud. Students from K-6 read aloud to an adult or high school student for ten minutes each day. This is recorded on a special tally bookmark from the Library with a simple parental signature. (If the child reads for more than ten minutes, still only one signature can be recorded per day please.)

Reading aloud is a very import life skill for children and adults alike. It helps to build fluency, expression and confidence in reading and speaking aloud.

When children read for  $14 \times 10$  minute sessions, they return their signed off bookmark to receive a new bookmark which progresses through a colour system, two small prizes, a merit award and their name in the weekly newsletter.

Negotiate a regular time with your child, that works for both of you and log it into you regular family routine schedule. This is essential time where you can sit quietly one-on-one to listen to your child, not only read, but also share their thoughts with you from the busy day.

You're too busy? Do you watch TV or play computer games – at all in the week? Then you have time you can reprioritise. Choose kids first.

Listening to your child is a special bonding activity which lasts for only a very short time. All too soon they're grown up, in high school and too busy to sit closely with you. If you don't spend time with them when they're little, they won't be interested in spending time with you or listening to you when they're older. Time you invest with your children now will pay dividends when they're teenagers and later adults.

If you do nothing else for your child's education – Please make the effort and time to listen to them read K-6. It really matters. It really helps. It really works. It's that simple. Ten minutes a day.

# D&C Roles

At the P&C AGM in March each year, all P&C positions become vacant. They are refilled by attending parents, following a vote of those present at the meeting. Any unfilled positions will be filled by vote at the next ordinary P&C meeting.

#### **Role Descriptions**

The following role descriptions are intended as a guide only. Each role may vary depending on the individual that fulfills the position and the requirements of the committee at the time.

#### The P&C Executive

#### President:

The president is responsible for the overseeing of the P&C and the associated committees, presiding and running the P&C meetings and liaises with the NSW P&C Association and the Principal over any P&C and school matters.

The president is responsible for:

- The successful functioning of the P&C.
- Fostering participation of all members.
- Welcoming new members & supporting volunteers.
- Chairing Meetings.
- Signatory on bank accounts.
- Acting as the P&C spokesperson.
- The President is automatically a member on sub-committees.

#### Vice President (x2):

The vice president in the absence of the President presides over the meeting. The Vice President supports the role of the President and may be required to:

- Chair meetings or parts of meetings under the direction of the President. Chair meetings in the absence of the President Signatory on bank accounts.
- Take on the responsibility of supporting / leading sub-committees.
- Represent the President if the President is not available.

#### Secretary:

The Secretary shall attend meetings and keep a record of all business conducted, collect and receipt any mail received, and then hand the mail onto the appropriate sub-committees. The Secretary is responsible for:

- Taking minutes at meetings.
- Writing outgoing correspondence.
- Maintaining records.
- Signatory on bank accounts.
- Receive and table incoming correspondence.
- Give notice of meetings.
- Maintain official records.

#### Treasurer:

The Treasurer receives and deposits all monies, maintains records, draws cheques and presents accounts to each meeting, and presents all records for auditing each year. The Treasure is responsible for:

- Receives and deposits money.
- Maintains records.
- Draws cheques and presents accounts.
- Signatory on bank accounts.
- Must ensure books are kept up to date.
- Audit organising and co-ordinating audit of books.
- Reporting of all transaction and a bank reconciliation at P&C meeting, an annual report to be presented at P&C AGM.

### NSW Bus Safety Week – 18<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> February.

Over 1 million students in NSW travel to & from school each day, many by bus. In the last five years, three children were tragically killed after alighting from a bus and being struck by another vehicle. NSW Bus Safety Week runs from 18-24 February 2019 to highlight the importance of bus-related safety issues for all road users. It is part of the Be Bus Aware campaign, which aims to improve awareness for how all road users can keep safe on & around buses. Tips for keeping safe around buses:

Adults – always hold your child's hand when crossing the road. Meet your child at the school or the bus stop – NEVER wait on the opposite site of the road and call them across. Wait until the bus has gone then use a safe place to cross the road. Supervise your child walking to & from the bus & crossing the road until they are at least 10.

Drivers – slow down to 40km/h when the bus lights are flashing.
