
While our main aim is FUN, FUN, we encourage all students to fundraise as all money raised will go directly back into benefiting our students.



## Read Aloud Bookmarks

## Did you know there are three different types of reading?

- 1. Reading silently for leisure and pleasure
- 2. Reading for meaning to inform comprehension
- 3. Reading aloud to an audience



The library operates a whole school K-6 'Reading aloud' rewards program. It is very easy and a great way to establish healthy 'reading routine' life habits for your family.

Children read aloud to an adult or high school student for ten minutes per day, with emphasis on fluency, punctuation, expression and inflection. (Only one signature a day please.)

With your child choose a text with lots of dialogue preferably, an easy read for your child. They are not reading for meaning/comprehension. We are focusing on practicing their oral reading skills. Thus the child may read the same book or chapter for several days in a row, to polish their performance.

From the school library your child needs to collect a 'Read aloud bookmark', which serves as a reading log to register readings. Just sign your name to verify the reading has taken place.

You do not need to record the title of the book or how many pages etc.

All you need is your child's first AND last name, class, then 14 days of reading ten minutes. For most classes – that will be a given task each week from their home room teacher. If that is the case for your child, just sign off. They don't need to do double the reading. They just get double the praise and recognition!

The students return the completed bookmark back to the library in either their library lesson, before or after school or lunch breaks for a 'Commendation Award,' which contributes to the whole school rewards system. Students also choose a small prize such as stickers or bookmark. Their name gets published in the School newsletter for that fortnight as well.

I'd like to encourage all parents to utilise this simple routine to build sound literacy skills for your children. That being students able to read fluently and with expression, with little or no preparation, aloud to an audience.

Reading aloud with confidence and fluency, is a very important life skill for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Much employment, secondary and tertiary education, includes being able to work collaboratively in groups of colleagues to complete tasks etc.



## Intention to apply for Year 7 placement in a selective high school in 2022

Dear Parent/Carer

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 11 March 2021.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2022, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available in late September 2020 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7.

The application website opens at that link on 6 October 2020 and closes on 9 November 2020. You must apply before the closing date.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Team for assistance after 6 October 2020.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

The tear-off slip below is not an application and the school cannot apply on your behalf.




