Principal's Message

It seems each term this year we have started off with some form of disruption which has impacted on school operations and our families. Thank you for your wonderful support on the first day whilst our LGA was still operating under "stay at home" orders.

Our school is still operating under Level 3 guidelines, which prevents nonessential visitors accessing our school. If our school moves to Level 2 – there are still significant restrictions on activities and visitors to the school. These ongoing restrictions will impact on the range of end of year activities we will be able to offer, however we always strive to have a positive influence each day.

Some of our programs have been able to operate virtually and I would like to congratulate Ben R (3/4T) on his performance in the **Multi-Cultural Public Speaking** competition. A fantastic effort Ben.



We also had 2 students successful at the next level of the **NSW Premiers Spelling Bee** with Noah H. (3/4T) and Keegan P. 5/6M winning their respective age groups. This competition had to be modified and the spelling Bee finishes this year at the regional level.

Work continues on several worthwhile projects at the school and we are expecting the shade sails to be in place in the next few weeks over the sensory garden. This will see the culmination of a joint project between the school and our amazing P&C and their fundraising committee. The shade sails will enable the sensory garden to be incorporated into daily learning activities by all classes.

Additional works will be carried out throughout the term and finished over the vacation period with our school benefiting from three exciting programs:

- Cooler Classrooms Air conditioning every learning space throughout the school, creating an even more engaging atmosphere in all classrooms.
- **LED Light Renewal** all internal lights in the school are being replaced with new efficient LED lighting, reducing our energy costs and contributing to minimising our carbon footprint.
- Rural Access Gap providing staff with new teaching and learning laptops, an additional 95 student laptops for use around the school and a new interactive whiteboard in every learning space.

School Programs/Activities

- Unfortunately, we have had to cancel the Year 4 Excursion to Wolstoncroft Point – Mr Harris will be sending information out to all families with information about how refunds will be made.
- Concert of Excellence as we have previously advised will not be going ahead. We are looking at what performance opportunities there may be for our students in the last few weeks of the term.
- Year 6 Dinner and Year 6 Graduation Ceremony at school will take place but may be modified depending on the Level our school is operating under at that time.
- Kindy Orientation activities will still take place with modified access for parents and carers.
- A new QR code for the school check in starts at our school from Monday for all visitors coming into the school.
- I'm extremely excited about joining into my first **Tacking Point Run4Fun Colour Explosion** (week 5 Thursday) and hoping that the fundraising targets results in myself and several of the teachers being slimed. A big thank you to the P&C Fundraisers for their behind the scenes efforts.

Colour Run

Crossing the Curriculum

We are so excited to have all of our students back and learning face-to-face in the classroom. Last term, we looked at multiplicative thinking strategies (recognising and working with relationships between quantitiesmultiplication and division). Our school continues to have a strong focus on multiplicative thinking. Our students continue to build their knowledge in developing efficient



numeracy strategies in working flexibly with an extended range of numbers that are suitable for their stage of learning.

Building strong number sense requires an understanding of numerical relationships, the use of strong mental imagery and the active making of connections between representations, situations, concepts, experiences and language. As students move from concrete to abstract representations of multiplicative situations, it is important that they continue to use the language that is associated with multiplicative thinking. I have included a multiplication table by Professor Dianne Siemon. This provides a representation of number facts to 100 and supports the language of multiplication by providing a concrete reminder of the meaning of multiplication for students.

Multiplication table

Building mental strategies for multiplication facts

Adapted from 'Building mental strategies for multiplication facts', Dianne Siemon 2008

Based on known facts/strategies, arrays and regions

The following strategies need to be interpreted in relation to the Multiplication Table below. Note: facts are read ACROSS the rows.

1. The 2s facts

eg, 2 ones, 2 twos, 2 threes, 2 fours, 2 eights DOUBLES, eg, "2 sevens ... double 7, 14" Establish RELATED facts, eg, 7 twos, think 2 sevens

2. The 3s facts

eg, 3 ones, 3 twos, 3 threes, 3 fours, 3 eights, 3 nines DOUBLES AND 1 MORE GROUP eg, "3 eights ... double 8, 16 and 8 more, 20 ... 24" Establish RELATED facts, eg, 8 threes, think 3 eights

3. The 4s facts

eg, 4 ones, 4 twos, 4 threes, 4 fours, 4 eights, 4 nines DOUBLE DOUBLES eg, "4 sixes ... double 6, 12, double 12, 24" Establish RELATED facts, eg, 6 fours, think 4 sixes

4. The 5s facts

eg, ... 5 threes, 5 fours, 5 fives, 5 sixes 5 eights, 5 nines RELATE TO TENS eg, "5 eights is half of 10 eights, 40 Establish RELATED facts, eg, 8 fives, think 5 eights or 4 tens OR RELATE TO READING TIME ON A CLOCKFACE see 1, 2, 3, 4, read as 5, 10,15, 20 minutes past the hour eg, "minute hand on 4 means 20 minutes past the hour

5. The 9s facts

eg, ... 9 sixes, 9 sevens, 9 eights, 9 nines TEN GROUPS LESS 1 GROUP eg, 9 eights is less than 10 eights, it is 8 less, 72" Establish RELATED facts using the same strategy, eg, 8 nines is less than 8 tens it is 8 less, 72

The Premier's Spelling Bee 2021

During the year, each class in Years 3-6 participated in The Premier's Spelling Bee Competition at school level. This involved all students being given a random word to spell across various categories which included: Arts & Entertainment, Science & Technology, Geography, Plants & Animals, Food & Nutrition and a General category. Students progressed to the next round if they succeeded, each time creating a new level of difficulty.

Kindergarten 2022

Orientation

In the past, we have always had a parent and child session to provide information to ensure a successful transition into primary school. This meeting was scheduled for Thursday 4 November, however due to COVID-19, this initial session can no longer take place. There will now be a virtual presentation for you to watch at your leisure. This information will be provided to you by email when finalised.

Transition

The three scheduled transition dates remain unchanged however only one adult/parent can drop their child off to our School Hall. Staff members and senior students will then take groups to the classroom for their activity time in the classrooms. Due to social distancing protocols, this process needs to be conducted quickly with one adult bringing their child into the Hall and then promptly leaving by an alternate exit. Signage will be displayed in the Hall and there will be students and staff to assist.
