Principal's Message

Thank you to all our families for their support while we battled through school closures, close and casual contact status and the associated timelines. We also acknowledge the unfortunate timelines of communication that we had to adhere to on advice from NSW Health. It was a very challenging time for our school community but we got through it together with overwhelming support and understanding from our families. So many teachers received beautiful feedback from families supportive of our efforts to keep in contact with them during a challenging time for everyone.

What a thrilling finale to the Colour Run fundraising – it is with great pleasure that I can announce that we have exceeded the target that will get Mrs Jordan and Mr Thompson covered in goo and slime. Woohoo! Well done to every student and family that have contributed to our "fun" fund raising targets. At this stage we are confident that the day will run on Friday December 10 in line with what we know about COVID restrictions etc. We anticipate that parents will be able to watch some of the action take place from the reserve behind the school.

The remaining events for the year will include Year 6 and Kinder Graduation assemblies, Year 6 Dinner, Kinder Transition and our annual Presentation Assembly. We are planning for all of these to go ahead, but we are restricted to school cohorts, which will limit our opportunities. Unfortunately, parents are unable to attend our presentation events, so we are currently planning to record or livestream those events. As it is stipulated to us, all of our normal reward-based activities are restricted to our school site only for the wellbeing and safety of our students.

The P&C have directed the funds raised from the Colour Run towards erecting shade sails over the concrete area between the Kindergarten and Year 1 classrooms. In initial conversations with our Schools Infrastructure staff, they have suggested that we also look at waterproof style sails which are more expensive but would add extra functionality to this space. The existing shaded tables will be relocated for use by the Year 3&4 classrooms on the grassed area behind the library. We are also looking at adding some external doors to the Kindergarten classes and pathways to increase our access to the Sensory Garden.

Other projects that are happening at the school over the next few months include:

- Our LED light upgrade will be completed in late December
- Our Canteen kitchen upgrade will be completed in late January and include some new appliances and a stainless steel layout for the entire canteen.

- The work replacing all of the rusted fascia around the school will commence in January and continue in Term 1 however disruption to classes will be minimal.
- The installation of air conditioning in all our learning spaces, via the Cooler Classrooms program has been moved to the Easter vacation period.

School Numeracy Targets - Updates

Our school has had an enhanced focus on our mathematics programs across every classroom and as a result of our NAPLAN student performance this year our staff were invited to a forum hosted by Ms Lisa Muir, Executive Director, Regional North and West School Performance Directorate. The invitation to the forum was generated by the significant growth that we achieved in our school target – Increase the achievement of Year 3 students from 45% to >53% (band 5 or above) and Year 5 students from 26% to >34% (band 7 or above) in the top 2 bands as measured in NAPLAN.

We showcased the teaching and learning strategies we are using to a forum of Principals throughout our School Performance directorate. This year 59.4% of our Year 3 students were represented in the highest two bands (band 5 or above) and 30.5% of our Year 5 students were represented in the highest two bands (band 7 or above). Attendance at the forum was a great acknowledgement of the effort our students and staff have been making in improving our numeracy results.

2022 Staffing Model

At this stage with our enrolment numbers for 2022 we expect to form 25 classes across the school. This is 2 less classes than we had this year and reflects our enrolment of approximately 650 students. If your circumstances are changing or you are aware of families who are intending to enrol next year please let the office staff know.

Crossing the Curriculum

Parents and carers can make a difference to a child's reading journey. Your role as an advocate for your children's reading success cannot be overestimated. It has a direct impact on the ease and confidence with which they pursue their reading and writing. There are many proven benefits of reading aloud with your child. Reading together may help to motivate your child and instil a love of books.

Reading begins at a very early age when children start to take notice of the print that surrounds them and the talk that includes them. Children begin to engage with reading and writing experiences that attract their attention and interest before they go to school. They pay attention to books they like and often insist on many re-readings of their favourites.

Conversation is also a key to literacy learning.

Children enjoy opportunities to interact. Recent research indicates that children are more adept at communicating when they are involved in extended conversations. Children need to be included in interactions with significant others and to ensure that happens, electronic devices may at times, need to be limited. It is in the context of engaged conversations that children expand their vocabulary, increase their understandings of the world, learn about themselves, and learn the nuances of the language and effective communication.

Encourage your child to borrow and care for books. It can be a good idea to rotate books and make them readily accessible. Older children may benefit from a bed light to read at night. Introducing children to different kinds of books — humorous books, books with beautiful illustrations, rhyming books, pop-up books, electronic books, novels, and factual texts promote reading and help to maintain interest in books. With your children, you can visit places such as the local library, markets and bookstores to find books that are interesting and fun to share.

It is the joy of sharing a good book on a daily basis that can set the foundation for reading success. Reading regularly with your child and encouraging independent reading with conversations about what the book is about, helps to support language comprehension and can tell you what your child can understand from their reading. Providing a regular, reading routine at home assists children in their quest for reading success.

1B Innovation



We've just been awarded a Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant!






We've been successful with our application for a 2021 Woolworths Junior Landcare Grant for our project, Hen Pen and Vegetable Garden Regeneration.


