Deputy Principal Forecast

Welcome back to Term 2! It has been fantastic to see everyone at school and settled back into their exemplary manners, behaviour and work habits. Term 2 is already a very busy term with a great deal happening so far. Year 4 and 6 have been sitting their Check-in Assessments in Reading and Numeracy with the data from these being analysed by teachers to identify individual and cohort strengths and weaknesses. Our scripture and ethics classes have begun this week while our cultural and sporting groups have also resumed where they left off last term.

Week 3 will be a very busy week with school photographs happening on Tuesday the 4th May and Wednesday the 5th May. Years 3-6 will happen on Tuesday along with our leader photos while K-2 will have their photo taken on the Wednesday. Sibling photos will happen on either day during recess and lunch breaks. The photo envelopes went home last Friday and will need to be brought back to school on the day of the photos. Information about payment is on the envelopes. A spare one can be picked up at the office as well as sibling photo envelopes. If your child is absent on their photo day the catch-up day is Friday 21st May.

Our school cross country carnival is on Thursday 6th May. The Years 2-6 (8-year-old to 13-year-old) will compete from 9-11am while the K-1 (5-year-old to 7-year-old) will compete between recess and lunch. Spectators will need to abide by our school COVID 19 guidelines, which allows spectators to view from vantage points outside the school grounds.

At the end of that busy week on Friday 7th May, Year 3 are attending a Historical excursion of Port Macquarie to the Historic Court House, Museum, Town Green and Mrs York's Garden. Year 4 will be attending the following week on Friday 14th May.

Crossing the Curriculum

As children progress through their school years, it is very important that checks are made along the way to see how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and mathematics – skills that will set them upon the path to success as adults.

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in NAPLAN tests.



At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress. NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills; the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. These are skills that students have already learnt through the school curriculum.

Teachers will ensure that students are familiar with the test formats and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN is not useful and can lead to unnecessary anxiety. If you have any questions about your child's preparation for NAPLAN, please make a time to speak with your child's teacher.

It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. You can support your child by reassuring them that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply do their best. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process – it does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers

about student performance. Our school will be administering NAPLAN sessions this term in weeks 4 and 5.

Self-regulation is an important aspect of our social and emotional skills and is a key component of a child's growth and development. Self-regulation is the ability to understand and manage your behaviour, emotions and reactions to things happening around you. It enables us to manage emotions like anger, excitement, frustration and helps us to calm down after something exciting or upsetting happens in our world.

Self-regulation helps children to:

- maintain attention
- behave in socially acceptable ways by giving children the ability to control impulses and make positive choices
- make friends by enabling children to share, take turns and express emotions in appropriate ways
- become more independent by guiding good decision making and promoting positive behaviour across a range of situations.

Self-regulation skills can be taught and nurtured. We are very excited to be introducing 'The Zones of Regulation' as a framework to support our students to develop self-regulation. 'The Zones of Regulation' supports children to learn how to regulate their emotions independently. It teaches students to recognise and identify their feelings and equips them with the tools they need to regulate their actions.

I look forward to sharing more information about our implementation of 'Zones' over the coming weeks.


